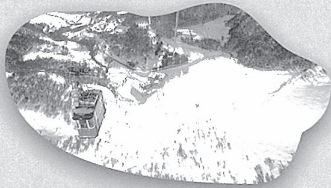
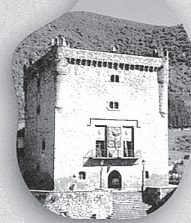


Afternoon Festivity of The Peak of San Carlos (sacred Heart)

A very popular afternoon festivity takes place in this raised summit in the years ending in 0 or 5 at an altitude of 2,212 metres.

Potes

The capital of Liébana is an interesting historical-artistic area where it is worthwhile to spend some time wandering around and discovering every hidden corner.



Fuente De Cable Car

It allows us to surpass the wall of the impressive Fuente De Circus and places the visitor at an altitude of 1,800 metres, right in the middle of the central massif of the Picos.

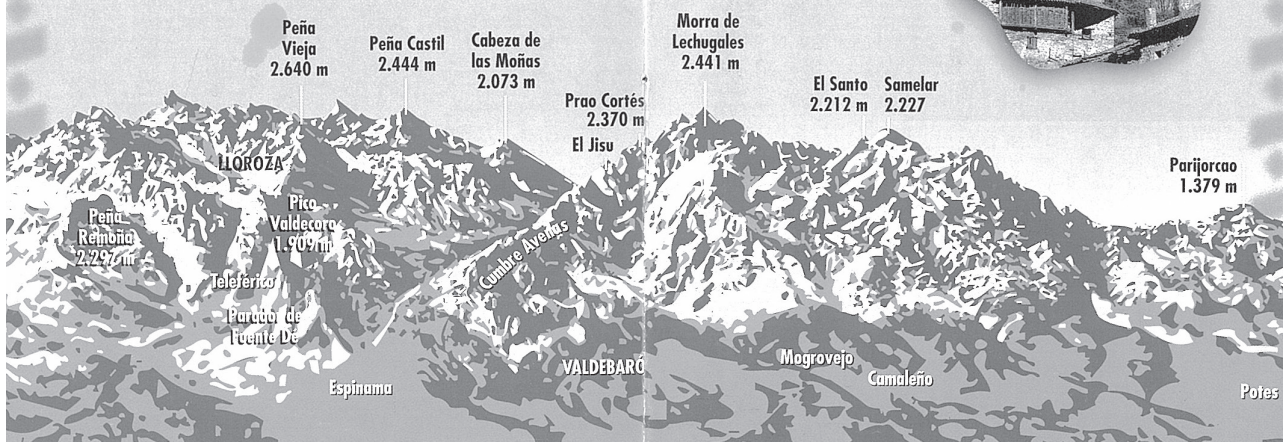


Peña Vieja peak

At an altitude of 2,613 metres is the "roof" in Cantabria, one of the most prominent heights in the Picos, surpassed only by a few metres by Torrecedredo Peak (2,648) and Llabrión Peak (2,642).

Mogrovejo

One of the most beautiful villages in Liébana, presided by a slender battlemented medieval tower.

Virus

A virus is a computer program that can copy itself and infect your computer without your permission or knowledge. Viruses are easily spread from one computer to another via e-mail attachments, or carried on removable devices, such as floppy disks, CDs, and USB drives. Antivirus measures must be put in place to avoid this problem. They are now offered by many e-mail providers.

The majority of files containing viruses will not affect your computer if you don't open them. So don't open or accept files or e-mails from people you don't know or trust.

Reading. The Prophecy of the Titan

Read the following text:



In 1898, Morgan Robertson wrote *Futility*, a story about a ship called the 'Titan'. In essence, the book described a tragedy which is very similar to that of the 'Titanic'. But the famous catastrophe of the 'Titanic' happened... in 1912!

There are amazing coincidences between the novel and the real tragedy. First, there is the name of the ship: the ship in the novel is the 'Titan', very similar to the 'Titanic'. The 'Titan' was 800 feet long; the 'Titanic' was just eighty feet longer. Both the 'Titan' and the 'Titanic' had three propellers. In the novel, the shipwreck takes place in the North Atlantic, just like that of the 'Titanic'. The 'Titan' was sailing from New York to Liverpool; the 'Titanic' left Southampton for New York.

Two thousand and five hundred people drowned in the 'Titan', which is just a few hundred more than in the 'Titanic': two thousand and two hundred. The 'Titan' sank because of an iceberg collision and excessive speed; the 'Titanic' sank for identical reasons. The tragedy in the novel happened because there were not many lifeboats and so it happened with the 'Titanic'. The disaster of the 'Titan' takes place during a night in April; the 'Titanic' hit an iceberg at 11.40pm on 14th April 1912 and sank two hours later at 2.20 am on the 15th, fourteen years after *Futility* had been published. Don't you think there are too many coincidences?

Opening times

- October to March: daily 10.00am - 8.00pm
- April: daily 10.00am - 9.00pm
- May and June:
 - Sunday to Thursday: 10.00am – 9.00pm
 - Friday and Saturday: 10.00am - 9.30pm
- July and August: daily 10.00am - 9.30pm
- September: daily 10.00am - 9.00pm

Getting here

By tube

Waterloo is the closest underground station to the London Eye. It is about five minutes walking distance. Exit the station following signs for the South Bank. Embankment and Charing Cross stations are close together on the north side of the River Thames. Both tube stations are a ten-fifteen minute walk to reach the London Eye. From the station, cross over Hungerford Bridge.

Westminster tube station is the closest station to Big Ben and the Houses of Parliament. From Westminster tube station, take exit one and follow signs for Westminster pier.

By rail

The closest train stations to the London Eye are Waterloo and Charing Cross.

Waterloo is the closest rail station to the London Eye. It is about five minutes walking distance; take exit six for the South Bank and follow the signs. Charing Cross is about a fifteen minute walk to the London Eye. Cross over Hungerford Bridge.

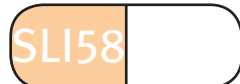
